EXPERIENCE

Some of Carmen's notable experience includes the following:

- Acting for countless claimants to secure them compensation as a result of motor vehicle, public liability, or workplace accidents.
- Acting for a dependant whose long-term spouse committed suicide following a workplace injury in circumstances where WorkCover alleged that the dependant was not financially dependent upon the deceased due to the deceased not being in receipt of any income at the date of his death. Following an appeal to the Regulator and lengthy submissions drafted by Carmen, the Regulator overturned WorkCover's decision to issue a dependency certificate entitling the dependant to compensation.
- Acting for a claimant in a complex policy interpretation dispute with her insurer which ultimately led to the claimant being paid out in excess of \$500,000.00 in both TPD and Trauma benefits (despite the insurer initially resisting the payment of both on the basis that they were to be set off against one another).
- Acting for a defendant in a personal injury claim arising from an assault which was heard for 7 days in the Supreme Court and later appealed to the Court of Appeal, along with numerous other trial matters demonstrating vast trial experience.
